The Rubber Track Tread Pattern

Another tip on how to choose replacement rubber tracks is to carefully consider which <u>tread pattern</u> will be most advantageous for your application. When choosing a tread pattern, the most important factor to consider is the type of operating environment you will use your machine in.

For example, if you plan on operating your machinery on grassy or fragile surfaces, a smooth tread that provides low ground pressure will be ideal. If you need to operate your machinery on uneven or wet surfaces, however, a track pattern that offers optimum traction, such as a TDF multibar pattern, will likely be a better option.

Once rubber tracks suffer damage, you can't repair them. They are a disposable item that will need to be completely replaced.
